Scaling-up cooperation and synergies with other UN organizations, especially the IFAD, WFP, and WHO and providing a framework for cooperation with relevant scientific and technical organizations.

Fostering innovation and transformation by mobilizing the FAO teams.

Promoting the FAO's role as a global reference organization building on robust scientific and technical knowledge in the field of food security and nutrition, with an aim to enhance its relevance, effectiveness, efficiency and transparency.

Working to ensure that the FAO remains an open, agile, responsible organization committed to building its actions jointly with all stakeholders.
