A stronger political dialogue

- January 2012: Signature of the first strategic partnership between France and Australia to strengthen bilateral dialogue
- November 2014: Official visit of the President of the French Republic to Australia a historic first
- April 2016: State visit of the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia to Paris
- May 2016: Visit of the French Prime Minister to Australia
- 14 July 2016: Australia, guest country of honour at the Bastille Day celebrations
- March 2017: Visit of the Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Development –
 Signature of the statement on enhancing the strategic partnership

Focus on economic ties

France

600 French companies are working in Australia including almost all (35) of the companies listed on France's CAC 40 stock market index. They employ 60,000 people and generate €18.4 billion.

Australia chose a French company, DCNS, to build its future submarines (programme estimated at €34 billion).

Australia

France's eighth biggest trade surplus (€1.7 billion on average over the last ten years; €1.4 billion in 2016).

300 Australian companies have invested in France, where they employ around 40,000 people.

Dynamic cultural and scientific cooperation

Dynamic academic and scientific cooperation focused on excellence and innovation:

- France is Australia's third ranking European partner when it comes to research;
- The network of French researchers Australia French Association for Research and Innovation (AFRAN) – has nearly 600 members. It spearheads action and development of bilateral scientific cooperation;

- All the major French research bodies are present: French National Centre for Scientific Research (CNRS), National Institute for Agronomic Research (INRA), French Institute of Health and Medical Research (INSERM) and Institut Pasteur;
- French university communities are growing: Paris Sciences Lettres, Sorbonne Paris Cité, Paris Saclay, Université de Toulouse.

Increase in French and bilingual language programmes:

- French, the leading European language taught;
- With 250,000 primary and secondary school students and 8,000 university students, it is the third most studied foreign language in Australia;
- A growing network of schools and French and English bilingual sections: 5 accredited or government-regulated schools; 4 bear the the LabelFrancEducation label, new bilingual sections are opening soon in Adelaide;
- 30 Alliances Françaises.

An important outlet for French cultural and creative industries:

- "So Frenchy, So Chic", a festival featuring today's popular French music with more than 3 million followers on social media;
- A strong presence of our cultural heritage in Australian museums (Degas, Versailles exhibitions);
- A French film festival that is growing in popularity with more than 168,000 film goers in 2016.

France is one of Australia's favourite destinations

1.3 million Australian tourists visited France (out of a total population of 23 million Australians) in 2016. Australia is therefore France's tenth biggest tourist market.

A shared memory

More than 400,000 Australians fought in the First World War, 10% of the population at the time. More than 60,000 died on the battlefield. This episode is considered to be a founding act of the Australian nation.
